Donate School Uniform



Free Second Hand Uniform

If you are struggling to source uniform, then we have a large number of donated items that we are able to provide you with, free of charge.

Please just pop into the school reception and ask what we have available.

AGS School Fund and 6th Form Bursary

The school has a very small amount of money to support families who may be struggling to provide food, coats, shoes etc. to their young people. This fund can also support curriculum trips where appropriate. More information can be found [here](#).

Free School Meal and Pupil Premium Funding

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Separately, AGS can receive funding to specifically support the education of pupils who qualify for Pupil Premium:

- Pupils who are recorded as eligible for free school meals, or have been recorded as eligible in the past 6 years, including eligible children of families who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)
- Children looked after by local authorities, referred to as looked-after children
- Children previously looked after by a local authority or other state care, referred to as previously looked-after children

Again, please do not hesitate to contact Mrs Price if you think that you might be eligible.

The **Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme** is funded by the Department for Education (DfE) to provide young people who are in full-time education (Reception to Year 11) and eligible for benefits-related free school meals with access to enriching activities and meals, for free, during the three main school holidays: Winter, Spring and Summer.
