At the time of writing in September 2025, AGS recognises the continuing challenge that so many families face with ongoing rises in the cost of living. Similarly, as a school, we are facing our own considerable financial challenges.

Despite having cut 10 teaching staff in the last 2 years, Governors and I face some very difficult decisions and challenges in the weeks and months ahead. How do we continue to afford staffing? How do we replace ageing science labs, a 1912 roof and a heating system from the 1960s?

Community, however, is at the heart of AGS, and therefore, as always, I like to hope that we can approach these challenges together and in partnership.

The 'Assist Give and Support' initiative asks all in our community to consider 'what support do you need?' and 'what support can you give?'

Section One of this booklet outlines how you can assist AGS and other families without the need to donate money - e.g. your time or the recycling of uniform and other items can be hugely helpful.

Free Second Hand Uniform

If you are struggling to source uniform, then we have a large number of donated items that we are able to provide you with, free of charge.

Please just pop into the school reception and ask what we have available.

AGS School Fund and 6th Form Bursary

Free School Meal and Pupil Premium Funding

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The quaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Separately, AGS can receive funding to specifically support the education of pupils who qualify for Pupil Premium:

- Pupils who are recorded as eligible for free school meals, or have been recorded as eligible in the past 6 years, including eligible children of families who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF)
- Children looked after by local authorities, referred to as looked-after children
- Children previously looked after by a local authority or other state care, referred to as previously looked-after children

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme is funded by the Department for Education (DfE) to provide young people who are in full-time education (Reception to Year II) and eligible for benefits-related free school meals with access to enriching activities and meals, for free, during the three main school holidays: Winter, Spring and Summer.
