Safe Parking and Driving

A few polite requests for any parent/carer or student driving to AGS:

1) Please do not simply stop and drop off in front of the middle school gate. This not only blocks the road but stops pupils using the pavement to access the pedestrian gate and crossing - they have to walk into the road to avoid you. Please drop slightly further away to keep our pupils safe.

2) Please do not come on site whilst buses are loading and unloading at either end of the day. If you are on-site, please drive slowly and take particular care at the pupil crossing.

3) Please remember to be considerate of our neighbours when parking in (or driving down) local streets. Please in particular do not park so that drives get blocked or an emergency vehicle such as fire engine cannot easily get through.

Message from Mrs Price



I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself, having now joined the senior leadership team at AGS. It has been a wonderful first couple of weeks, and a big thank you to all the students for making me feel so welcome.

I will be responsible for looking at personal development, including our extra-curricular offering, PSHE curriculum, outreach work, and the AGS House system, among other things. One of the first things we are introducing this year is our new Life Programme. This will run every Friday morning, in an extended form time, for all years of the school.

What is the Life Programme?

It is a programme of activities/ speakers/ opportunities for students focused on building key life skills. This will range from; understanding about the importance of nutrition and exercise, to learning how finances work, to knowing how to take care of a bike/ car, to learning how to engage in our democratic system, to learning about world events, to working on developing literacy skills and oracy, to taking opportunities to give back to the school and wider communities.

What is the rationale?

Personal development is a key part of our school development plan. The Life programme supports the AGS ethos that students will leave us with more than just good grades; they will also develop key life skills, and become 'decent human beings' who understand how to give back to society. It is designed to complement and add to our PSHE provision.

How can you support your child?

The Life programme curriculum is hugely varied. You can support your child by talking to them about what they have learned, and where possible, provide opportunities for them to build on their learning at home. For example, you could provide the opportunity for them to plan a food shop with a budget.

In addition, if you feel you have any skills you could offer to help deliver this curriculum, we would love to hear from you! For example, it may be you could come and deliver a yoga class, or come in to talk to students about how to look after your car, or give a talk about marketing a business (the list goes on).




