Dear Parents and Carers,


The last 3 weeks have again been busy at AGS - a true reflection of the busy, engaged and diverse life of the school community. On January 18th, it was a pleasure to welcome nearly six hundred students to our 6th Form Subject Sampling Evening, from over seventy schools across the region. The sense of maturity, resilience and community shown by all students (whether currently at AGS or joining us for the first time) was a delight to see, with students successfully navigating their seven A level taster sessions as they (we hope) continue on their journey to joining us in September.


A fantastic turn out at lunchtime hockey club!

# Guest Speaker

What is it like to swim the English Channel? A story of perseverance and determination!

Students were given the opportunity to attend a Monday lunchtime talk this week. Our guest speaker was Will Hodgess, who came in to talk about his experience of swimming the English Channel with the aim of encouraging people to take action to address climate change.

Will explained that growing up he had only really been interested in football, but had to give this up due to injury, so turned his attention to swimming. He then found his adventurous nature led him to sign up to attempt swimming across the English Channel (21 miles in a straight line, but impossible to swim it in a straight line so more like 30 miles!). He referred to it as the 'Mount Everest' for open water swimmers due to the strong tides and freezing temperatures.

Will talked honestly about the extreme challenges, and how there were many times he wanted to give up, but by keeping in mind the reasons for doing it, and spurred on by a wealth of support and inspiring messages he didn't quit. Students were able to ask lots of questions about the challenges and how he overcame mental barriers. They were also able to feel how cold the water would have been and imagine themselves swimming in it for 16 hours straight!!

Will then explained how the experience had spurred him on to start his own company to encourage as many people as possible to do something to help address the climate crisis.

Will is the uncle of one of our students, and a massive thank you to him for giving up his time to come and talk to students. If any parents/ relatives feel they have something students would benefit hearing about, we would love to provide more opportunities for them to hear about different experiences.
