Laminating the dough to ensure layers of buttery, flaky pastry is certainly not easy! This week they are turning this pastry into a delicious savoury tart.







This Fortnight at AGS

They put their theory into practice by carrying out a thermal decomposition of copper carbonate.






Translation competition


Exams Update
